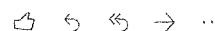

It seems to me that what the police do off the area of the court building is up to them and they clearly intend to follow the van to the gates of our compound at the back. Personally once the defendants are in court I do not see the need for armed officers in court as there should be no risk of any sort if the security at the front door works and the dock area—which is secure—is checked carefully ahead of the hearing—if necessary the public could be excluded by making it the first hearing in that court room
