

## **D9 Prepares For and Participates in Dynamic Entry or Intervention**

The implications of initiating the tactical options of dynamic intervention and dynamic entry should not be underestimated. Full consideration must be taken into account of the need to plan thoroughly and train regularly for these methods. Of all the tactics likely to be employed by armed police those of dynamic intervention and dynamic entry are most likely to be scrutinised under Human Rights legislation.

Dynamic intervention to rescue hostages should be distinguished from a dynamic entry to arrest and secure readily disposable evidence, both of which are intended to protect life.

To be successful, both dynamic intervention and dynamic entry require a high degree of teamwork and rehearsed methods. They create, by their nature, a situation in which decision making under stress becomes critical and individual officers tasked with undertaking such an entry require a high level of skill and adaptability.

## **D10 Undertakes Deliveries, Collections and Reconnaissance**

This module focuses on the techniques involved when making an overt or covert approach to a structure during an operation involving the deployment of armed officers.

During a siege situation there may be a need to overtly approach a structure to make deliveries or collections. These may include the delivery of food and communication devices or the collection of persons or other items.

It may also be necessary to conduct a reconnaissance or provide armed protection for persons, such as technical support personnel, who are required to covertly perform an activity at a structure.

## **D11 Uses Less Lethal Weapons**

D11.1 and 2 These Modules focus on the considerations applicable to the use of the L104 Launcher as a less lethal option in an operation involving the deployment of armed officers or in situations of public disorder.

D11.3 This module focuses on the policy, operating procedures, and techniques involved in using and maintaining the Taser. This module should be considered as the foundation required before any officer may carry and/or use the Taser for police purposes. The module contributes toward the required training leading to accreditation as an authorised firearms officer.
