Re: Death of Jermaine Baker on the 11th December 2015

On the 22nd December 2015, I attended the Metropolitan Police Perivale Vehicle Pound, London at the request of the IPCC. The purpose of my attendance was to interpret the nature and distribution of the bloodstaining found in the black Audi A6 motor vehicle, index 'KM13 YPT'. Furthermore, to determine the exact positioning of the front passenger seat and the position of Jermaine Baker within that seat. I was also requested to use Blood Pattern Analysis on the inside and outside of the vehicle to assist with determining the position of W80/Jermaine Baker. The findings relating to the GSR contingency sampling and the firearm aspect of this case will be the subject of separate reports by my colleagues Mark Bowden and Khaldoun Kabbani respectively.

Prior to my examination of the vehicle, I was informed that as a result of the incident, Jermaine Baker had sustained injuries to his left wrist (including a severed artery) and his neck (including severed edges of the carotid and jugular). For the purpose of my interpretation I have made the assumption that all of the blood originated from Jermaine Baker.

This report summarises my findings in relation to the blood distributions observed and my opinions are as follows:

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1. The blood on the front passenger seat and surrounding surfaces is the result of Jermaine Baker being sat in that seat whilst bleeding from an arterial injury. The blood which had spurted onto the surfaces can be explained by it originating from the injury to his left wrist.
2. The blood distribution indicates that the front passenger seat was in its current position at the time of the incident. In addition, the seat belt was in the locked/used position. The possibility that Jermaine Baker was sat on the locked seat belt rather than wearing it as normally intended cannot be excluded.
3. The absence of significant blood staining, including blood spurts, together with the absence of blood on the internal door handle and door release is, in my opinion, due to the door being open at the time that Jermaine Baker sustained his injuries.
4. The blood drips on the external surface of the front passenger door indicate that Jermaine Baker had moved, or been moved, outside of the vehicle whilst bleeding.
5. There was no spurted blood on the external surfaces of the vehicle to indicate that Jermaine Baker had sustained his injuries outside of the vehicle.
6. There was no visible damage to indicate that a bullet had gone through the windows or body of the motor vehicle.

Conclusion

- Jermaine Baker was sat in the front passenger seat when he was shot. At this time, the seat belt was in the locked/used position and the seat was in the same position as that at the time of my examination.
- The door was open when Jermaine Baker was shot.
- Jermaine Baker then moved, or was moved, from the vehicle via the front passenger door towards the front of the vehicle.
