AJW/17 One black sweatshirt

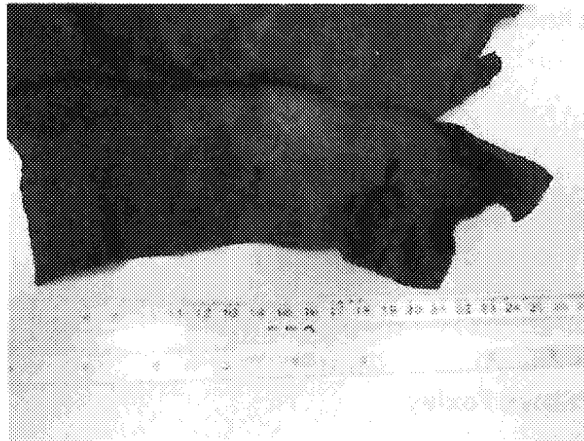


Fig. 2 – Damage to the left sleeve (near the cuff) of the sweatshirt, AJW/17

As mentioned in my report dated the 31st March 2016, an area of the zip, and the fabric immediately next to it, appeared damaged – see Fig. 1. Similarly, two holes were present to the left sleeve (near the cuff) – see Fig. 2.

RAC/10 One black man bag "Nike"

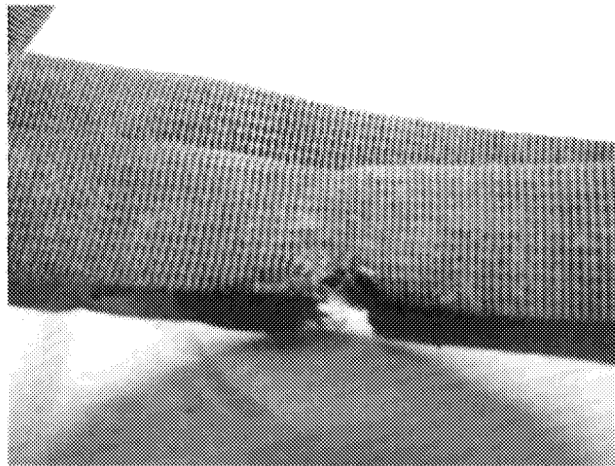


Fig. 3 – Damage to the strap of the bag, RAC/10

As mentioned a small hole was present to the bag strap – see Fig. 3. Overall, the strap is in a good physical condition. Heavy blood staining was present around the area of damage.

If it is accepted that this damage was caused by the bullet used in the shooting of Jermaine Baker then this area of the strap would have been in the front of the neck area when worn

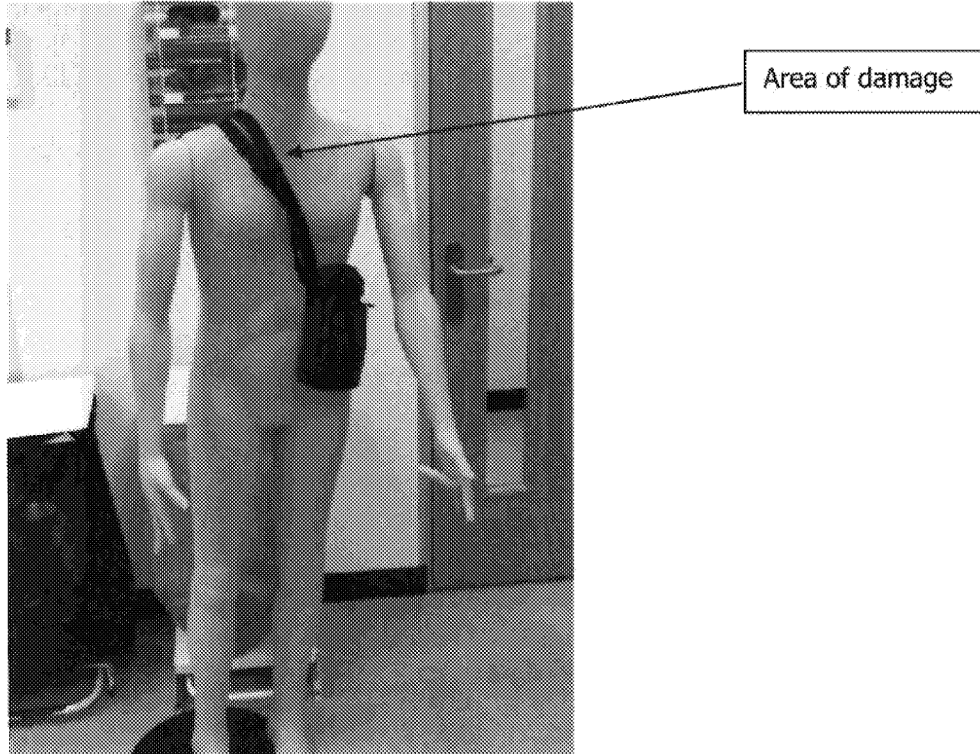


Fig. 4 – Photograph showing approximate positioning of the bag, RAC/10, when worn over the right shoulder

over the right shoulder – see Fig 4. This photograph shows the expected location of the bag if worn in this way.

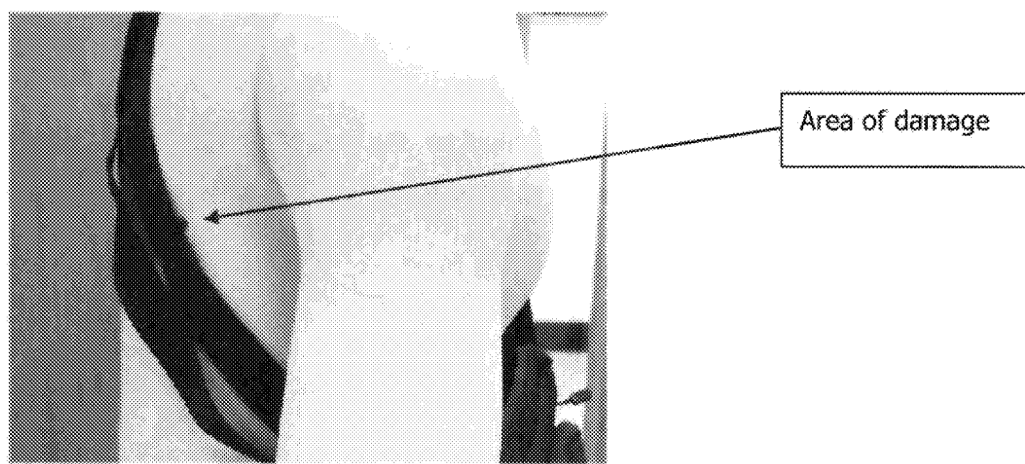


Fig. 6 – Photograph showing approximate positioning of the damage when worn over the left shoulder
