

following shots fired. I updated S48 over the phone to tell him one occupant of vehicle had been shot in chest + that we are all ok + that I would further update him when I could. I ensured officers who had detained the other two males were ok + didn't need any immediate help. I told the TFC – FE1 – I didn't at that point know who firer was – as priority was delivery of first aid – but that I would find out. I received an enquiry about getting the other two prisoners away but I stated I didn't want any other vehicles coming into the narrow street until LAS had arrived, which might have delayed them. LAS arrived at some point during this period + were briefed by R116 as to the condition of the casualty. I was aware that TFC was keeping a clipboard log + I ensured she was recording times of arrival. She was. Therefore there was no need for me to duplicate it and I was free to manage the scene. I suggested to FE1 that a RVP for arriving resources to be deployed from was WINKFIELD RD J/w BRACKNELL CLOSE + that I needed WINKFIELD RD closed too. I also asked that investigating officers from SCO7 be brought here ASAP to relieve my team + to accompany the casualty to hospital for continuity purposes.

Some officers were now wearing balaclavas + face coverings as several members of the public were using phones to take pictures/video (presumably – from the angle they were held at) I assisted an officer with putting his on who had bloodied hands (R116) I also took R116s taser bag which I placed around my neck to make his medic role less irksome. At some point I was passed a face covering that I put on I don't recall where in the time line this was. I was able to ascertain who the police firer was by asking medics who were rotated out of the ELS – one at a time. The third person I asked was W80. He said he had fired when I asked him. I asked if he was ok and for a brief account of what happened. He said words to the effect of 'he moved his hands up to his chest area' whilst physically demonstrating the move. He did not give + I didn't ask for any justification + I stopped there. I told him I would get him away and sat down in a vehicle. I was satisfied that I didn't need to relieve the officer of his weapons. We were joined by G79 who stated he had a vehicle parked down the road within the cordons. As he was the other supervisor present + he wasn't here at the time of the shot – he seemed to me to be the logical choice to accompany W80. They walked off together to the J/off vehicle. As a Control room has been set up (C3000) for this operation I knew that they would take primary for informing our senior managers. At some point soon after – Hems arrives to take over ELS. There was a lot of kit – medic kit on the floor by the casualty. Next to one of our bags was a small black 'man bag' on the pavement, in front of the AUDI R116 pointed this out to me and told me it belonged to the casualty. I didn't touch it or go near it.
